Presidents Message

### PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Well it's Ground Hog's Day again. I don't know about you but every year on this date I think about the movie "Ground Hog's Day" and for me being deployed to Tazar Hungary. For this deployment I was assigned as the Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics (DCSLOG) with what was called the National Support Element (NSE). This was an organization that was created by Central Command (EUCOM) to allow the 21<sup>st</sup> Theater Support Command to get back to supporting our troops in Europe, not just those who doing the peace keeping mission in Bosnia. All this was before 9/11 and the war on terror.

When I was there the leadership was very concerned about troop safety, so even though we were stationed in Hungary we had the same force protection measures as our Soldiers in Bosnia. We lived in a compound (it was a former Soviet air base) and we were allowed to go into the local town, provided we went in groups of 10, wore our uniforms and had one armed soldier in the group. The result was we seldom left our base, even though Hungary was safer than Germany.

If you have been deployed you know that it doesn't take long for every day to start to be the same and the "Ground Hog Day" effect takes over. In my case it was up at 0600, a short walk from my billets to the DFAC past the MIG 17 on display for breakfast, often passing the same people each morning. Then to the office for the shift change briefing and the staff meeting at 0815. When I was with the NSE things had become very routine, a big event was when the weather turned unexpectedly cold and there were reports of black ice on the

MSR's to Croatia and Bosnia, or some convoy was late. Everyone thinks deployments are filled with a lot of action, but really it's a whole lot of routine, doing important tasks needed to insure that our Soldiers had what they needed to be successful. The hard part is after a while nothing seems different.

So what's this got to do with the 63 Infantry Division Association (USAR)? Well our Annual Meeting is an opportunity to do something different on a Sunday in April, a chance to see old friends and perhaps learn something too. This year we have asked CSM Robert Roberson to be our speaker. CSM Roberson is completing his assignment as the CSM for the 79<sup>th</sup> Sustainment Support Command. He is a Soldiers Soldier and has a current perspective on what life is like in today's reserve units.

Remember, Sunday 19 April, 2015 is the date of our Annual Meeting, be there to tell your stories about how you fought off the effects of Ground Hog Day when you were deployed.

# Names of Fallen Service Members to be Added to California Vietnam Veterans Memorial

Sacramento – The California Vietnam Memorial Name Committee agreed to add the names of 31 California Veterans who died while serving our country in the Vietnam War. The 31 names are scheduled to be added to the California Vietnam Veterans Memorial and then unveiled during a ceremony in Capitol Park on March 29, 2015.

"We are honored to formally recognize the service and sacrifice of our brave men in uniform," said Peter Gravett, Secretary, California Department of Veterans Affairs (CalVet).

"Although our recognition is decades late, California's salute is equally heartfelt and deserved for all of our fallen service members and their families."

### **A True Story**

Military History teacher at Robinson High School in Little Rock, did something not to be forgotten.

On the first day of school, with the permission of the school superintendent, the principal and the building supervisor, she removed all of the desks in her classroom. When the first period kids entered the room they discovered that there were no desks.

'Ms. Cothren, where are our desks?' She replied, 'You can't have a desk until you tell me how you earn the right to sit at a desk.' They thought, 'Well, maybe it's our grades. 'No,' she said. 'Maybe it's our behavior.' She told them, 'No, it's not even your behavior.'

And so, they came and went, the first period,

second period, third period, still no desks in the classroom. Kids called their parents to tell by early afternoon television news crews had started gathering at the school to report about this crazy teacher who had taken all the desks out of her room.

The final period of the day came and as the puzzled students found seats on the floor of the desk-less classroom, Martha Cothren said, 'Throughout the day no one has been able to tell me just what he or she has done to earn the right to sit at the desks that are ordinarily found in this classroom. Now I am going to tell you.'

At this point, Martha Cothren went over to the door of her classroom and opened it. Twenty-seven (27) U.S. Veterans, all in uniform, walked into that classroom, each one carrying a school desk. The Vets began placing the school desks in rows, and then they would walk over and stand alongside the wall. By the time the last soldier had set the final desk in place those kids started to understand, perhaps for the first time in their lives, just how the right to sit at those desks had been earned.

Martha said, 'You didn't earn the right to sit at these desks. These heroes did it for you. they placed the desks here for you. They went halfway around the world, giving up their education and interrupting their careers and families so you could have the freedom you have. Now, it's up to you to sit in them. It is your responsibility to learn, to be good students, to be good citizens. They paid the price so that you could have the freedom to get an education. Don't ever forget it.'

By the way, this is a true story. And this teacher was awarded Veterans of Foreign Wars Teacher of the Year for the State of Arkansas in 2006. She is the daughter of a WWII POW.
